A meeting of the City of Portageville Board of Aldermen was held on Monday, December 4, 2023, at City Hall, 301 E Main St. Mayor Walker called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

APPROVAL OF **AGENDA** 

Moved by Alderman Estes, seconded by Alderman Adams and unanimously carried, to approve the agenda as submitted.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES** Building Commission- 11/6/23 Reg. Meeting- 11/6/23

Mayor Walker asked members of the Council if they had read a copy of the Minutes made available to them three days prior to the meeting. All answered in the affirmative.

Mayor Walker asked if there were any additions or deletions to the minutes. There were none.

Moved by Alderman Adams, seconded by Alderman Johnson and unanimously carried, to approve the submitted minutes for the month of November.

# ORDINANCES OR RESOLUTIONS

Ordinance 1342-Amendment to Municipal Court Agreement with City of Marston Mayor Walker introduced Bill No. 1342:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 1341 TO PROVIDE FOR A YEARLY FEE OF FIVE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED EIGHT DOLLARS FOR THE MUNICIPAL COURT SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF MARSTON, NEW MADRID COUNTY, MISSOURI

Mayor Walker entertained a motion for the First Reading of Bill No. 1342. A motion was made by Alderman Johnson and seconded by Alderman Adams. All members voted in favor.

Mayor Walker entertained a motion for the Second Reading of Bill No. 1342. A motion was made by Alderman Adams and seconded by Alderman Johnson. A roll call vote was taken.

Voting was as follows: Alderman Adams, yea; Alderman Johnson, yea; Alderman Estes, yea; Alderman Hollingshead, absent.

After hearing Bill No. 1342 read two times, passed, and approved, Mayor Walker declared Bill No. 1342 to become Ordinance No. 1342 this 4<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2023.

Ordinance 1343-Capital Improvement Sales Tax On Ballot

Mayor Walker introduced Bill No. 1343:

AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING A CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS SALES TAX OF ONE HALF OF ONE PERCENT AND CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF PORTAGEVILLE, MISSOURI ON THE QUESTION OF WHETHER TO IMPOSE SAID SALES TAX AND FURTHER PROVIDING THAT SAID SALES TAX SHALL TERMINATE AUTOMATICALLY TEN YEARS AFTER THEIMPLEMENTATION THEREOF.

Mayor Walker entertained a motion for the First Reading of Bill No. 1343. A motion was made by Alderman Johnson and seconded by Alderman Adams. All members voted in favor.

Mayor Walker entertained a motion for the Second Reading of Bill No. 1343. A motion was made by Alderman Johnson and seconded by Alderman Adams. A roll call vote was taken.

Voting was as follows: Alderman Adams, yea; Alderman Johnson, yea; Alderman Estes, yea; Alderman Hollingshead, absent.

After hearing Bill No. 1343 read two times, passed, and approved, Mayor Walker declared Bill No. 1343 to become Ordinance No. 1343 this 4<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2023.

**PUBLIC FORUM** 

Mayor Walker asked if there were any visitors present who would like to address the Board of Alderman.

Gail Lunbeck commented that the community should be prepared in the case of a takeover by citizens due to militia groups and asked if the police department was prepared for those types of situations.

#### **DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS**

#### **RONNIE ADAMS- CHIEF OF POLICE**

Turned in a written report for the month of November. Chief Adams stated that the interrogation room cameras are up and running.

#### **GEORGE DELISLE- FIRE CHIEF**

Turned in a written report for the month of November.

DeLisle reported that they responded to 111 fires for the year. He also stated that Overhead Door Company had quoted \$1100.00 to repair the broken spring on Bay 1 and rollers in Bay 2. Discussion followed. Mayor Walker asked for a motion to approve the repair. Motion was made by Alderman Adams and seconded by Alderman Johnson. All members voted in favor.

#### PARK BOARD

No report was turned in for the month of November.

JONATHAN THACKER- STREET & SOLID WASTE SUPERINTENDENT Turned in a written report for the month of November. Thacker reported that the department is halfway through with Quadrant 1 with the ditch cleaning program and should be completed in the month of December.

Thacker also asked for Roosevelt Mosby to receive a raise of \$1.00 per hour. Discussion followed. Motion was made by Alderman Johnson to raise Mosby's pay by \$1.00 per hour. Alderman Adams seconded. All members voted in favor.

JONATHAN THACKER- CODE ENFORCEMENT
Turned in a written report for the month of November.

## JIMMY WYMAN- WATER SUPERINTENDENT

Turned in a written report for the month of November.

Members of the Board of Aldermen questioned Wyman's order from Midwest Meter that totaled more than \$15,000.00. Discussion followed. Wyman stated that he will check with Dave from Midwest Meter about repairing the broken meters.

TERRY WHEELER- SEWER SUPERINTENDENT Turned in a written report for the month of November.

SCOTT PATTERSON - PRETREATMENT No report was turned in for November.

#### ROOSEVELT MOSBY- ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER

Turned in a written report for the month of November.

Alderman Johnson asked if it would be possible to post pictures of dogs picked up by animal control. Discussion followed. Mosby explained that we could be held liable if someone falsely claimed and we surrendered an animal to a nonowner. He then explained that a stray hold is for 5 days and then we surrender an animal to rescue.

Turned in a written report for the month of November.

#### PROJECT REPORTS

### WATER TREATMENT PLANT

Mayor Walker presented a pay request for Horner Shifrin in the amount of \$5280.00. Motion was made Alderman Adams to pay the received invoice. Alderman Estes seconded. All members voted in favor.

#### **LEAD SERVICE LINE INVENTORY**

Mayor Walker presented a pay request in the amount of \$3500.00 for Total H20 Solutions. Motion to pay the above amount was made by Alderman Johnson and seconded by Alderman Estes. All members voted in favor.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

# **EMPLOYEE HEALTH INSURANCE BIDS / RENEWAL**

Mayor Walker informed the Board that United Healthcare had proposed a renewal for the current employee health insurance plan at an increase of 6.6%. Mark Gibbins had checked with other carriers, but the only reputable carriers to respond were Cigna and Anthem, but they were considerably more for less coverage. No other bids had been submitted. Discussion followed. Mayor Walker asked for a motion to renew the current health insurance with United Healthcare at the proposed increase of 6%. Motion was made by Alderman Johnson. Alderman Adams seconded. All members voted in favor.

## TREE REMOVAL HUFFMAN AVE

Mayor Walker presented two bids that were received for the tree removal on Huffman Avenue. The bids were as follows:

Discussion followed. Tree #3 is wrapped in power lines and its position in relation to the easement is being examined. Mayor Walker asked for a motion to allow Moore's Tree Service to remove Tree #1 and Tree #2 and contact Ameren about trimming or removing Tree #3. Motion was made by Alderman Adams and seconded by Alderman Estes. All members voted in favor.

#### **ILLEGAL GAMING MACHINES**

Mayor Walker explained that the illegal gaming machines had been discussed at the Mayor's Meeting in New Madrid and that they had given cities the steps needed to address the machines in their cities. Discussion followed. Terry McVey, City Attorney, advised that the City proceed with caution and expressed some concerns. The Board of Aldermen agreed to table the issue for now and revisit it later.

# SEWER DEPT- AUGER GEAR BOX REPAIR QUOTE

Mayor Walker explained that when the new auger was installed they found issues with the gear boxes and needed to be replaced. He presented a quote for the repair in the amount of \$12,172.00 from Johnson Screens. Discussion followed. Motion was made by Alderman Estes to repair the gear boxes in the amount of above. Alderman Adams seconded. All members voted in favor.

# ADVERTISEMENT FOR PUBLIC HEARING TO ABANDON RIGHT-OF-WAY – FORMAL VOTE

Mayor Walker stated that a text vote had been taken to proceed with a public hearing for abandoning the right-of-way where the previously abandoned water tower sits north of East First Street and east of the railroad tracks between the two properties owned by Combs Realty. A formal vote was needed. Motion was made by Alderman Johnson and seconded by Alderman Adams. All members voted in favor.

#### LIQUOR LICENSE - FAMILY DOLLAR

Mayor Walker stated that Family Dollar Stores of Missouri, LLC dba Family Dollar #33250, located at 135 E State Highway 162, Portageville, MO 63873, had submitted an application for Package Liquor and Sunday Sales. Discussion followed. Mayor Walker asked for a motion to approve the package liquor license and Sunday sales.

**NEW BUSINESS** 

Motion was made by Alderman Estes and seconded by Alderman Adams. All members voted in favor.

#### **CLEAR BASIN TAX COLLECTION RENEWAL**

Mayor Walker informed the Board of Aldermen that the tax program that the city utilizes would be expiring in April 2024. The quarterly rate would be increasing to \$1737.50. The Board had the option to renew annually, lock in the rate for a 3-year term or cancel the subscription with a 30-day notice. Discussion followed. Motion was made by Alderman Adams to lock-in the rate and renew for a three-year term. Alderman Johnson seconded. All members voted in favor.

MISSOURI RURAL WATER ASSOCIATION MEMBER DUES
Mayor Walker presented the 2024 Membership Dues notice from
Missouri Rural Water Association in the amount of \$819.02.
Discussion followed. Motion was made by Alderman Johnson to pay
\$819.02 to Missouri Rural Water Association. Alderman Adams
seconded. All members voted in favor.

#### POLICE TAHOE ENGINE REPAIR

Mayor Walker presented a labor estimate from BK Service Center in the amount of \$1000.00 to replace the engine in one of the police department Tahoes. Two quotes were presented for parts- a quote from Delta Auto Parts in the amount of \$3750.00 for used with 50,000 miles and \$5750.00 for remanufactured, and a quote from Harry Blackwell for remanufactured parts and labor in the amount of \$9426.01. Discussion followed. Motion was made by Alderman Johnson to allow BK Service Center to place a remanufactured engine for a total estimated cost of \$6750.00. Alderman Adams seconded. All members voted in favor.
